Morrison and Rhodes win

The British pair have won the 49er European Championship in Weymouth

The most wind yet greeted competitors on the final day of the 49er European and 29er World Championship. 18 knots were blowing into Weymouth bay by the time the first groups were released to go sailing.

In the 49er fleet the plan for the day was to send out the silver fleet to do two races outside the harbour then send the gold fleet to do one race inside the harbour. When the gold fleet had finished their race the bronze fleet would be sent out to complete a race on the same course. The 29er gold fleet were the first Latest news! to be released, followed by the bronze fleet and later on in the day the silver fleet.

In the 29er fleet Silja Lehtinen and Scott Babbage had an excellent final day, taking two first places and a sixth along with overall victory in the event. However, they were not run away winners with Dylan Fletcher and Rob Partridge who pushed Lehtinen and Babbage all the way to the finish.

The breeze was increasing considerably by the time the 49er gold fleet were half way through their race. Even in this windier weather the boats were impressively close together with only just over a minute separating all the boats at the finish. Stevie Morrison and Ben Rhodes had a poor race but continued to leeward going into the medal race. Rodain Luka and George Leonchuk managed to recover from a poor start to the finals series to just scrape tenth position and the final medal race spot.

The medal race took place just off Weymouth and Portland Sailing Academy and with the wind gusting up to around 20 knots it was a spectacular sight. The British tams put on a good performance in front of the home crowd with Chris Draper and Simon Hiscocks taking second place and Morrison and Rhodes taking fourth and the event title. Morrison and Rhodes managed to put in a consistent set of results and are deserving champions.


