"Win the Day" Format

After 3 days of qualifying, the top 8 boats advance to the final day. Each boat carries forward a score based on their relative performance across each of the first three days, ensuring a merit-based entry into the medal series.

Finals Day Scoring System:

- Each team receives a score from each of the first three days based on their rank among the 8 finalists, not the overall fleet.
- Each boat takes their relative rank from each of the 3 days racing, making up 3 scores. (I.e. If you were the winner of day 1, day 2 and day 3 you start the finals with 3 points or if you finished 18th on day 1 with a UFD,5,7 but 8th out of the finalists you carry 8 points for day 1.)
- Maximum carry-forward score = 24 points (if a boat ranks 8th on all 3 days)
- Minimum carry-forward score = 3 points (1st all 3 days)
- Standard tiebreakers apply using World Sailing's low-point system.

Final Day (Day 4):

- 8 boats race 3 single-point races
- No discards all points count
- At the end of these races, the boat with the lowest combined score (carry-forward + finals races) wins.
- If a boat becomes mathematically unbeatable before Race 3, the regatta can end early.

Key Features:

- Merit-based reward: Boats carry forward meaningful scoring advantages based on consistent performance across all three days.
- Inclusive and competitive: All 8 boats remain in contention throughout, keeping the racing exciting and open
- Becomes difficult to keep track of what's happening without the results on hand.
